New Features and Enhancements

Automatic Credential Assignment

This feature allows Open Mobile to silently authenticate users so users don't need to enter (or even remember) a username or password. To enable this feature, contact an iPass admin or Customer Care.

Travel Preferences

Users can optimize storage on their device by downloading hotspot lists by region (users can switch, add, or remove regions at any time).

Password Assistance

Open Mobile makes it easier to include password retrieval information for users. To attach a customized XML file, log into the Open Mobile Portal and navigate to Configuration tab > Manage Profiles > Configure Profile > Custom Profile Attachments.

System Requirements

- Wi-Fi capable Windows 8.1 (or above) device
- Users need an iPass account in order for the service to function. In addition, the user must be connected to the Internet, have an Activation Code, and (if necessary) a PIN to activate Open Mobile.

126216	Users may experience some trouble logging off AT&T Wi-Fi networks.
125973	Due to a limitation with Microsoft, Bing Maps cannot display maps of unsupported regions/countries. For information on which region/countries are not supported, please visit the Microsoft developer help site.
123778	Users may be asked for their credentials (even if AutoConnect is enabled), if their device goes into sleep or hibernate mode. If this is the case, users should enter their credentials when prompted.
123743	Some users may experience issues when connecting to Gogo Inflight where the Activate Service button isn't displayed properly. Users can scroll to see the button properly.

126115	Microsoft Surface RT devices do not support iPass mobile broadband devices/drivers.
